Mixed reviews for iPad

Apple's just-released iPad is receiving mixed reviews from the healthcare sector. The 1.5-pound tablet is not designed to be splash proof, nor does it currently have a camera, microphone or USB port, critics note. On the up side, an already existing library of medical apps gives the iPad a lead on other tablet PCs. Its larger screen also makes for easier viewing. In addition, iPhone users can transfer their purchased apps to an iPad without paying for them a second time.



Wii balance board rated suitable replacement for clinical force platforms

Physical therapists often use force platforms to assess residents' balance, posture and rehabilitation progress. However, the high cost of these products—several thousand dollars on average—has limited their use. But researchers at the University of Melbourne recently concluded that Nintendo's Wii Balance Board can provide results "suitable for clinical testing" at a fraction of the cost.



Personal tracker keeps an eye on wandering-prone residents

The GeoSkeeper personal tracker and communication system was recently unveiled. The watch-like device has GPS and mobile phone functionality that allows users to send their coordinates if they are calling for help. The device can be programmed remotely, allowing caretakers to set phone numbers into memory and predefine a geographic area, the breach of which will trigger an alarm call.
